Reynolds Nursing Program Aces National League of Nursing Accrediting Team Evaluation

RICHMOND, Va. (November 12, 2007) – The National League of Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC) accrediting team recently informed the J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College Nursing Program it is in compliance with all of the standards required for renewal of accreditation. In February, the accrediting team will recommend to the accrediting commission renewal of accreditation at the maximum number of years allowed, eight years, which is the strongest possible endorsement that can be made by a team of peer nurses who evaluate quality standards in nursing programs around the country.

The NLNAC is responsible for the specialized accreditation of nursing education programs, both post-secondary and higher degree (Master's Degree, Baccalaureate Degree, Associate Degree, Diploma, and Practical Nursing program).

JSRCC's Nursing Program is the second largest program in the Commonwealth of Virginia producing about 200 graduates each year, significantly impacting the nursing shortage in the Greater-Richmond area.

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College is the third largest college in the Virginia Community College System. Reynolds offers a variety of programs and services to the residents of the City of Richmond and the counties of Hanover, Henrico, Goochland, Louisa and Powhatan. The college operates three comprehensive campuses located in rural, urban and suburban settings and serves over 18,000 credit students.
